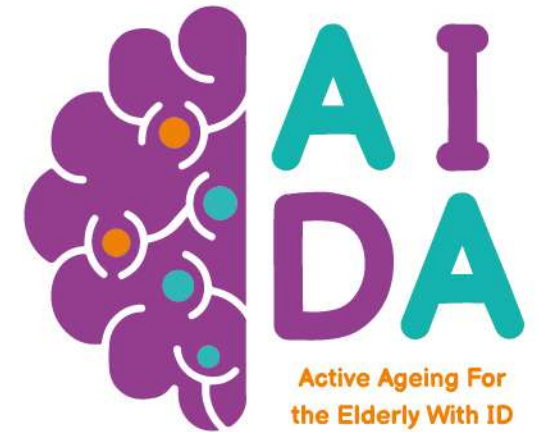

What is AIDA?

AIDA is a project funded by the Erasmus + program (KA2) that seeks to improve the quality of life of the elderly with intellectual disabilities through the design and implementation of an improvement in the training of professionals who work with this group. The main goal is to offer students training programs that are strictly directed towards training in issues related to active aging of elderly people with intellectual disabilities, designing training tools, quality technical content and adequate methodologies that favor teachers of VET of Professional Families of Community Services and Social Health Care receive adequate training. At the same time, the project will improve the quality of the VET curriculum in the framework of active aging of elderly people with intellectual disabilities, contributing to the improvement of the quality of life of the group.



What will be produced

- Identification of the needs and characteristics of elderly people with ID, through the creation of a map which will indicate the specific bio-psycho-social needs and main characteristics of elderly people with intellectual disabilities, and the technical skills which professionals working in the field need to acquire.
- Creation of a curriculum for VET that improves the technical training of teachers of professional families directly linked to the target group, thus creating a flow of knowledge between teachers and VET students in the framework of attention to the elderly with Intellectual Disabilities.
- Design of an Online Training Course, which allows to improve the training of a large number of professionals who work with elderly people with intellectual disabilities.

Target Groups



Direct

- Teachers from the fields of health and social care in VET centres
- Professionals and other healthcare workers who care for people with intellectual disabilities

Indirect

- VET students from the fields of health and social care, who will receive better training in the field of care for the elderly with intellectual disabilities
- VET institutions and other relevant stakeholders
- Elderly people with intellectual disabilities, and their families
