

What is SCORE

SCORE is a 3-year European project which will bring an innovative intervention in the framework of education of professionals in working with refugees & asylum seekers, in areas except the first entrance and hot spot areas.

This kind of professionals could be service commissioners and providers working in local authorities in children's and adults' services, who would benefit from receiving specific training and support by VET teachers & trainers. It will also be of interest to asylum seeker & refugee organizations and voluntary organizations in these areas. The project will also help educate the local societies on the refugee humanitarian problem.

The project started on September 2017 and ends on August 2020.

SCORE's Aims

To provide a new type of education to community and health workers, in the field of effective contact with refugees, and to any other volunteers.

To bring to the participants a greater understanding and responsiveness for the vulnerable groups, such as refugees

To encourage these professionals have a more active participation in society, for refugees

To promote to the participants a more positive attitude towards the EU values

To raise awareness in local communities about refugees

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3rd Project Meeting



The **3rd project meeting** was held in **Aarhus** (Denmark), on **12th & 13th of June 2019**. SOSU Oestjylland College organised the meeting and participants were representatives from all project partners (from Greece, Italy, Spain and Denmark).

Main **objectives** of the meeting were to:

- Discuss the results of the training course for trainers;
- Present the 1st draft of the e-learning platform;
- Finalise the structure of the SCORE online training course;
- Discuss on the content of the training modules and the training material of the SCORE online training course

The needs of health professionals and community workers who are working with refugees and immigrants are different in each country. During the meeting, partners had long discussion on those needs, as they were aiming in creating an online training course, which will capture the reality in all partners' countries.

Partners also discussed the next steps for the implementation of the project and arranged the **4th project meeting** which will be held in **Patras** (Greece) by University of Patras and p-consulting.gr on **17th & 18th of December 2019**.

Multiplier Event in Basque Country



A successful **Multiplier Event** was held in **Basque Country** on **25th June 2019**, organized by **San Viator Center**, one of the project partners from Spain.

The **aim** of the Multiplier Event was Spanish partners (San Viator Center & Errotu) to present SCORE project, inform participants about immigration problem and provide information about the online training course for health professionals and community workers which will be piloted in all partners countries (Greece, Italy, Spain and Denmark).

Participants to the Multiplier Event were 40 professionals from different social organizations, who work directly in the care and treatment of immigrants and refugees.

Attendees had many questions and remarks to make and their feedback was an important contribution to the development of the online training course.



SCORE online training course

SCORE's online training course for community workers and health professionals is ready. Partners agreed on the number of the modules and the training material.

The online training course will be consist by four modules. Training material will be adapted in each partner country (Greece, Italy, Spain and Denmark), in order to meet the reality of the country on immigration issues and the needs of the participants (health professionals and community workers).

Modules of the online training course are the following:

- Legal framework. Social inclusion/integration;
- Vulnerable groups in immigrants;
- Introduction to Mental and Physical Health of immigrants;
- Specific Section for Health Professionals and Community Workers.

The **aim** of the SCORE training course for health professionals and community workers is to:

- increase the competences of professionals to approach and work with refugees and immigrants;
- understand refugees' and immigrants' needs;
- help refugees and immigrants to integrate in the community.

The online training course is scheduled to be implemented in all partners' countries during the 1st semester of 2020.
