Stress Test on good ecological sustainability practices

Think Twice partnership launched in July 2022 an interactive Stress Test on good ecological sustainability practices!

The Stress Test is an innovative tool, aiming to enable project managers to test how green their own project management and the ecological sustainability are for the practices they use.

The tool takes a different strategy to approach the topic of ecological sustainability within project management, through a game-based learning methodology. Dependent of the results of the test, project managers will be assigned an archetype and will lead to a personalized learning pathway for further information and learning materials on sustainable management.

Final Conference



The University of Aveiro also organized the project's final conference, which took place on July 21st, the day after the international partners' meeting. The conference took place in the Atlas Building in Aveiro city centre and had a panel of speakers of excellence to address some issues and practical cases related to the theme of ecological sustainability in project management. The conference included a lecture by Wisamar, the German partner and project leader, as well as Taste Roots from Italy. Dr. Paulo Sousa and professor and researcher Dr. Anabela Tereso from the University of Minho were also speakers as representatives of the Portuguese Observatory on Project Management.

During the conference, which was also broadcast simultaneously in the Facebook page of the Think Twice! project, the speakers presented theoretical content and practical examples of sustainable ideas, with useful tips on how to implement good sustainability practices in their daily activities. A Stress Test on good ecological sustainability practices was used by the participants, who were able to test the tool developed within the project.

The conference offered an excellent opportunity for participants to debate and exchange experiences on the topic of ecological sustainability in European project management, as well as the possibility of networking.



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
